From the Pastor

Defining Moments

A couple years ago our sermon series was called “Defining Moments” where we looked at the beginning of the Gospel of Mark and some of those defining moments of Jesus’ ministry. I’m quite certain everyone can recall perfectly every detail of every sermon (no, seriously, you might not even remember we HAD a series called that... it’s okay).

The point is, we all have defining moments in our lives. Those formative things – sometimes wonderful, sometimes tragic, that shape who we become. I did a quick internet search for significant events in the life of John Wesley in the month of February, any year of his life and some of the highlights are:

- **February 9, 1709: The Rectory Fire**

At age five, John Wesley was rescued from a fire at the Epworth Rectory just moments before the roof collapsed. He was left stranded on an upper floor, but a neighbor stood on another's shoulders to lift him through a window. His mother, Susanna, deemed him "a brand plucked out of the burning" (quoting Zechariah 3:2), believing he was spared for a special purpose.

- **February 14, 1727: Master of Arts Degree**

Wesley graduated with his Master of Arts from Oxford University, furthering his academic foundation.

- **February 6, 1736: Arrival in Georgia**

After sailing from England in October 1735, John and his brother Charles arrived in Savannah, Georgia, to begin their missionary work. During the voyage, he was deeply impressed by the calm faith of Moravian settlers during a violent storm, which highlighted his own lack of peace.

- **February 1, 1738: Return from America**

Wesley landed in Deal, England, having left Georgia in December 1737 after his ministry was deemed a disappointment. Upon arrival, he reflected on his spiritual state, realizing that though he went to America to convert others, he was never truly converted himself.

- **February 22, 1791: Last Sermon**

In his final year, just weeks before his death, Wesley preached his last sermon at City Road Chapel in London.

There are other important February events in his life, of course, and hundreds of small, but meaningful to him, events that he recorded in his journals over the years.

At five years old he is dramatically and miraculously rescued from a fire, at 87 years old he preaches his last sermon shortly before his death. I felt like there was a certain symmetry to his landing in Georgia full of newfound faith and excited for possibilities of ministry and almost exactly two years later landing back in England feeling despondent and even unconverted to the faith, though just a few months later he will have a true awakening of his spirit at a meeting on Aldersgate Street in London where he will write that his “heart was strangely warmed” and that he knew, finally knew, that he truly had been saved.

I’m sure that if I had done this in December or June or whenever, there would be many similarly life-shaping moments that would have been highlighted – I just happened to think of this for February. Each of those moments listed above not only shaped the direction of Wesley’s life and ministry, but also shaped and molded his faith, impacted how he experienced and understood the nature of God, the grace and mercy of God, the interrelatedness of personally holiness and social holiness and so many other expressions of our life of faith.

What are your defining moments? I wasn’t rescued from a burning building and I didn’t travel across the ocean to spend years as a missionary, but February has defining moments for me as well. Over the years, I lost my father to cancer in February, Lori and I got engaged in February, I have received several “you are about to be reappointed” calls in February. I’m sure there have been others but just those three are huge defining moments in my life: my faith actually strengthened after my dad died, though I had a couple years of being extremely angry with, and rude to, God before God got hold of me again; among many other things, Lori has taught me what it means to choose to love someone (all that 1 Corinthians 13 tells us); being a pastor in the UM system

means that I am itinerant – that the bishop may call me to move at any time – which has also deepened my faith and trust in God because, let's face it, the unknown is scary. But God is there.

What are your defining moments? How has God used circumstances to shape and mold your life and, even more importantly, your faith? It's not just a February question, but it is a question for THIS February.

Bless You!

Our choir sometimes concludes the worship service with a choral benediction that was given by God roughly 1,400 years before Christ.

In the Bible, Numbers 6:21 – 27 explains how it happened:



“The Lord said to Moses, Tell Aaron and his sons, “This is how you are to bless the Israelites. Say to them:

“The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious unto you;
The Lord turn his face toward you and give you peace.”

So they will put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them.”

That scripture has been set to music in many languages ever since then. But the version we sing (in English, of course) was written by Peter C. Lutkin. He was born in Wisconsin in 1858 and died in Chicago in 1931. Peter was an exceptional organist, helped begin the American Guild of Organists and founded the School of Music at Northwestern Illinois. His most famous choir anthem is “The Lord Bless You and Keep You” subtitled “Farewell Anthem with Sevenfold Amen”. His masterful arrangement has been enjoyed in ministry around the world for the past 125 years and is just as relevant today.

During this cold and flu, and imminent allergy season, may GOD richly bless you! Whether you sneeze or not.

Flock Talk

Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the high country and go after it until he finds it?

Luke 15:4

There is a ministry in Florida dedicated to disaster relief, restoration and helping the homeless. The have a memorable name: "Operation Lost Sheep". They search for the lost, the lonely and forgotten and bring relief both physically and spiritually.

Our ministries at Grace Church are very good at this. We go to great lengths to feed, clothe and minister to those in need. We have a good grasp on the "lost sheep" theory by searching for "the one" while the rest stay in a safe environment.

What if we got even better at it this year? What if we had some type of communication that could help notify us if there's a lost sheep? Not another committee, but another "commitment" to scanning the horizon more thoroughly.

We often hear someone say they haven't seen an individual for a while. That should cause us to sit a little taller, look a little farther and re-evaluate what we do when someone nibbles themselves lost, like a sheep. I do believe we would find lost coins and a prodigal son here and there.

All these types of lostness require a slightly different discipling approach. One may benefit from exhortation, the walking alongside and encouraging. Another may need a mild intervention. All will need love and most always giving someone the benefit of the doubt and no questions asked. Like the father in the parable who welcomed his son home with open arms.

I'm going to be looking for lost sheep. I grew up on a sheep farm and regularly bridled my horse to find "the one". It's something that should come naturally to us from the desires of our heart. God is planting this seed in our Disciple class this year and we're on a mission. Saddle up with us if you wish!
