From the Pastor

Easter People

n the last day of March we celebrated the resurrection of Jesus. The resurrection of Jesus is crucial to our faith, a clear and powerful demonstration of God as creator, giver of life, with authority and dominion over every aspect of creation, including that (to us) inescapable reality of death. The resurrection is God's declaration that nothing is impossible for God, the resurrection is the validation of Jesus' mission and ministry, the resurrection is proof for the questioner and a clarion call for the believer.

Paul dedicates the entirety of chapter 15 of 1 Corinthians to speaking about Jesus' resurrection. He is, in part, seeking to counter the notion (that had already arisen some 30 or so years after Jesus' death and resurrection) that Jesus didn't *really, physically* rise from the dead, but that it was a metaphor for going to heaven or a spiritual resurrection somehow. Paul asserts right from the beginning that the resurrection is foundational to our faith in Christ:

For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born. (1 Corinthians 15:3-8)

"...passed on to you as of first importance..." The resurrection matters because it changes everything. We are not just physical creatures who live this brief life and that's the end: we are created for eternal community with God and one another. We are integrated beings: body, mind and spirit, all created by God, all in God's hands from before we began to long after we end.

I read a devotional this week about being "Easter People" – that is, being Christ followers on this side of his resurrection:

What does it mean to be Easter people, to live on this side of the resurrection? One thing, for sure. We are now God's hands and feet in the world – we are the ones entrusted with carrying out God's mission.

That sounds both exciting and terrifying doesn't it? After all, Jesus left us big shoes to fill and the needs around us are overwhelming.

But the good news is that throughout history, God has empowered and used imperfect people just like us to bring the good news to others. (<u>https://d365.org/devotions/easter-people-april-7-2015/</u>)

The resurrection validated Jesus' mission and ministry and thus drives us forward in ministry. In the way God works and moves, we are created and commissioned to carry on Jesus' mission and ministry, confirmed by Jesus' resurrection which is a promise to us of God's presence and power. Paul says, "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep [died]." (1 Cor 15:20)

God empowers us to continue in the mission and ministry of Jesus so that the world might know that God loves them and Jesus died for them and that death is not the end, but God promises us life eternal. That is good news.

ere's a great song to carry in your heart and sing as a testimony and a challenge. It has taken me a long time to fully digest and appreciate this hymn written back in 1913 by a traveling evangelist ordained in the Methodist Episcopal church. George Bennard was born in Youngstown Ohio shortly after the Civil War. His hymn took him a long time to write as he studied John 3:16. "For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

You're allowed to take some time and contemplate the depth of Christ's love for us, too.

A Note from the Organist

here are several good reasons why I should not be able to play the pipe organ:

I have serious vision problems. For one, I was born severely cross-eyed and had 2 surgeries and glasses before I started kindergarten. When I was 7, my parents told the eye specialist that I wanted to play the piano. Right in front of me, he said, "Let her try if she wants to. She won't be able to do it."

I have little peripheral vision. This makes Grace's organ set-up particularly challenging for me, as I have to turn my head to make stop changes. I also have very little depth perception. The 3-D shows at Disney World are lost on me. I once was playing a piece in church when I noticed a note that I did not remember from when I practiced. Just as I was about to play it, it flew away. It was a small fly that had landed on the music. I do not see fine detail. Depending on the clarity of the music, sometimes I cannot tell sharps from naturals. Thankfully, I have a good memory.

My most interesting vision problem is that I am totally non-binocular. I only look out of one eye at a time. I could easily lose my place on the music if I switched eyes. Similarly, I very rarely look away from my music to look at hands or feet while playing.

Interestingly, my best vision distance is arm's length, exactly where the music sits on the rack.

Besides vision problems, I am very uncoordinated. My brother was a stand-out athlete for Kane. He lettered in football, basketball and track. In the summer, he played Legion baseball. He and my Dad had hitting or batting practice every night during nice weather. I was called on to field balls in the outfield. In years of doing this, I never once caught or fielded a ball cleanly. I got tons of exercise chasing the balls down. My nickname was Rigor. My Dad said rigor mortis was going to set in if I didn't move faster.

My children never got yelled at for spilling their milk or juice. I was more apt to spill than they were. I regularly end up with silverware on the floor at restaurants. I trip over cracks in the sidewalk all the time.

Then, I have a herniated disc in my back. Sitting on an organ bench could be painful. Pedaling could be painful. But it's not. I'm more comfortable on an organ bench than in an easy chair.

You may have heard the quote, "God doesn't call the equipped. He equips the called." I am living proof of this. It is only by a miracle of God that I can sit on an organ bench, read the music and coordinate 2 hands and 2 feet all at the same time. God has given me a passion for the pipe organ spanning over 50 years. And for this miracle and this passion, I am eternally grateful.

To All Prospective Acolytes,

We are pleased to announce the next session of acolyte training classes will be held soon. We will try to accommodate the schedules of those interested. Classes will be held for 3-4 weeks, on an after-school day or possibly on a Wed. evening. We will begin with a snack and a short video, "Chuck Knows Church." Instruction will include learning about church symbols, the acolyte's code of conduct, church history, and about the sacraments.
