What Really Matters To You?

was thinking about what is most important in my life – the people, of course – my family, my church family, my friends. What else matters? What else am I thankful for? I saw a post online that was "300 Things to Be Grateful for (2022)" which intrigued me for a couple reasons. First, this wasn't a Christian website, in fact this was a site that promotes "minimalist lifestyle" but is also a "self-help" and "personal development" website. Second, I wondered how someone outside of the church (where, of COURSE we're supposed to be thankful people) might think about gratitude.

The article spends some time talking about the benefits of gratitude: it can make you happier, gratitude changes you and your brain, it improves your sleep, increases your energy levels, may even extend your life! (article and study links abound...)

The author breaks the 300 "things to be grateful for" down into a bunch of subcategories. Some are exactly what you'd expect: personal things, health things, financial things, relationship things, little things... But there were some interesting categories too: food gratitude and wardrobe gratitude were categories I had to investigate. Another was "animals to appreciate" – like bees because they keep our food crops pollinated or elephants because they can dig water holes which allow other animals to get water to drink. Under the "everything else" category, I smiled when I read "thankful for GPS" and nodded my head when I read, "thankful for honesty" and "thankful for making right choices." Again, this is not a Christian website, but this does indicate some of the very real value of thankfulness.

And in a very real way, this is practicing what I would call "intentional gratitude." Paul says in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

Give thanks in all circumstances. I've said before, and we all know this (but it's hard to live it) – Paul doesn't say give thanks *for* all circumstances. Sometimes things happen that are just awful, soul-crushing, and life altering.

And yet.

Give thanks in all circumstances. Thanks for what? Bees and elephants? My wardrobe? I mean, sure, if that helps. But that's not what Paul is talking about. We as Christ followers give thanks because God is with us – even when life is a landslide of uncertainty and pain. God is with us. "If God is for us, who can be against us?" Paul asks (Romans 8:31b).

What "give thanks in all circumstances" looks like for me is David's words in Psalm 13:

How long, Lord? Will you forget me forever?
How long will you hide your face from me?
How long must I wrestle with my thoughts
and day after day have sorrow in my heart?
How long will my enemy triumph over me?
Look on me and answer, Lord my God.
Give light to my eyes, or I will sleep in death,

and my enemy will say, "I have overcome him," and my foes will rejoice when I fall.

But I trust in your unfailing love;
my heart rejoices in your salvation.

I will sing the Lord's praise,
for he has been good to me.

David is angry and frustrated (with God!) at the beginning of this Psalm. Look, God knows that sometimes life kicks our feet out from under us – and God know that sometimes we get mad at God for not doing something about it. And yet... "I trust in your unfailing love" – I have never doubted God's love for me and for all of us – even when I can't explain the bad things that happen to me and all of us sometimes.

And so "I will sing the Lord's praise, for he has been good to me."

What really matters to you? What are you truly thankful for?

hough you may find the greeting trite, 'tis the season to be happy. We have *so many* holidays to celebrate in the next two months. Besides the Big One, we have many reasons to celebrate for two full months.

Our 4th Sunday Advent Celebration is on December 18 with even more of your favorite Happy Holidays music. We'll celebrate Christmas Eve on Saturday with different services at 7pm and 11 pm. Stay tuned for further details. Christmas day follows immediately after Christmas Eve this year and will be another Sunday celebration. Our upcoming New Year's Day falls on a Sunday and may I suggest we approach the day as our "Second Thanksgiving" rounding out our two-month season of Happy Holidays.

Regardless of what's going on in your busy life in the next two months, spend some time in worship. Then *you* can enjoy two months *full* of Happy Holidays!

"BEING OF THE SAME MIND"

s promised, I am continuing to share sections from Church Unity: Through Paul's Eyes, a booklet based on lectures by N. T. Wright. He is a New Testament scholar, Pauline theologian and Anglican priest.



Grace Church, as a congregation of individuals, is navigating the waters of disaffiliation. As a former collegiate oarswoman, I can relate to that nautical metaphor! When there are eight rowers with the desire to move the boat quickly, there is no room for individuality. They must move as one unit or the forward momentum will be impeded. These individuals, with differing personalities, strengths and weaknesses, must become of one mind and move with each other to achieve success.

So it is with Grace Church. To move forward with our mission of "To know Christ and to make Him known", we need to be in harmony.

N. T. Wright asks, "What does it mean to live as an extended family across cultures and traditions? How are we to live together, unified, while being obviously different humans?" In Philippians, "Paul implores his readers to 'be of the same mind', meaning that they should all think in the way of the Messiah ... This is important because he expects them to really be living together, entangled in each other's lives, which will inevitably lead to some difficulties which need working through. And they can't be worked through if everyone is operating from wildly different mental starting points. The starting point must be the Messiah Jesus and his work in their lives, so that issues can be wisely and consistently resolved.

Thus, as always, what the community needs and what Paul pray for them is grace – the grace of the Messiah Jesus. ... Paul envisages the community as a single whole, indwelt together by the one spirit yet retaining their own individual vocations and personalities. He includes the command ... that they are to be unified, even in their difference.

This navigation is possible because the basis of the relationship is Messiah Love. ... Love today has regularly been collapsed into mere sentiment or passing whim. It regains its proper stature for Paul here because love respects and celebrates that which is not oneself. It can reach out to understand things that remain opaque to a hurried, or pragmatic, or self-centered glance."

While my heart is burdened by the possibility of conflict in our future, I trust that GOD is with us. As a family together in Christ, I pray that we can learn to live with and respect our differences.

Philippians 1:27: 'Whatever happens, conduct yourself in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ'.
