## What Standard?

read an article this morning called "5 Things that Christians Do that Non-Christians Despise." Here's the list, I wonder how this list hits you:

- 1. Judge people
- 2. Be hypocritical
- 3. Stink at friendship
- 4. Use "Insider Speak" or Scripture too often
- 5. Constantly invite non-Christians to church

And I'm reading the article and the first two things that he says non-Christians hate, judge people and be hypocritical, well, *everybody* hates that, right? But the author has a point, we are followers of Jesus who very pointedly said:

"Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.

"Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye."

Matthew 7:1-5

There's the judging and the hypocrisy all in one teaching moment. So, yeah, everybody hates being judged or everybody hates hypocritical people, but as Jesus followers we are to hold ourselves to a different standard, a higher standard.

Do we stink at friendship? Well, that depends. Have you ever had someone who wants to engage in a relationship with you because they wanted something from you? If you haven't, it stinks, and I'd like you to imagine how that feels because that's what non-Christians often feel like when a Jesus follower befriends them just to get them to come to church or just to "get them saved" or whatever the language you use. I've said many times, no one wants to be a project, and we can all tell insincerity when we experience it.

#### Jesus said:

My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command.

John 15:12-14

Does Insider Speak frustrate you? I was at a financial seminar a while ago and the presenter kept using financial terms and acronyms that I don't know, but she rattled them off like everyone in the room should be familiar with them. I squirmed a bit figuring I was the only idiot in the room who didn't understand but I raised my hand and asked, "Could you explain what these terms mean? I really don't understand." And she did. And I wasn't the only idiot in the room who didn't understand all the Insider Speak.

That's the kind of thing the article was talking about. We use some weird words in church, even simple things like "Bulletin" and "Benediction" are not commonly used outside of church. I'll preach about sacrifice or atonement or prevenient grace and, again, not words commonly used outside of church or they are used very differently outside of church. That's not to say we don't use them, but we should pay attention how and when we use Insider Speak and we should probably explain it when we use it.

We use the word love in the church all the time – but without context or explanation (or, especially, demonstration) it can sound to non-Christians like this: I love my dog, I love my coffee, I love my neighbor.

#### What's the difference?

Perhaps the most eloquent (and well-known) expression of an explanation of insider language comes from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians where he explains what love means to a Jesus follower:

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails.

1 Corinthains 13:4-8a

Do we constantly invite non-Christians to church? There's all kinds of numbers thrown around the internet about how many people invite non-Christians to church (it's *far* more common for a Christian to invite another Christian to "come to my church," what pastor Terry Teykl calls "sheep shifting"). Christians *do* invite their friends and neighbors to church. Ant the article points out that it is good and right to ask people to come to church, particularly non-Christians. But it comes back to the stinking at friendship question. Is that all you want from me? Get me to church and then move on, like I'm some kind of "get them to church" project?

I found this to be the most compelling bullet point (the reason I kept reading the article), and yet his least compelling explanation. But he does make at least one very important statement: "Remember, what people need most isn't an invitation to a building; it's an invitation to a relationship – with you and, ultimately, with Jesus."

Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus. The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, "We have found the Messiah" (that is, the Christ). And he brought him to Jesus.

John 1:40-42

There's a quote that gets misattributed to Gandhi. I don't know who first said it, but for someone, Christianity can have an identity problem. And whoever first said it, it's a phrase that gets used against the church time and time again: "I like your Christ. I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are so unlike your Christ." Regardless of the source of that quote, it has persisted because, well, sometimes we who follow Jesus don't look or act or talk all that much like Jesus. As Brennan Manning famously *did* say: "The greatest single cause of atheism in the world today is Christians: who acknowledge Jesus with their lips, walk out the door, and deny Him by their lifestyle. That is what an unbelieving world simply finds unbelievable."

What standard should I hold myself to? None other than the standard of Christ. To love as he did. To have compassion as he did. To trust God as he did. To lay down my life, take up my cross every day and follow.

William Longstaff, a church treasurer, is only known to have written this one hymn, in England in 1882. Meditate on this message for a moment:

# Take Time To Be Holy Hymn 395

Take time to be holy, speak oft with thy Lord; Abide in him always, and feed on his word. Make friends of God's children, help those who are weak, forgetting in nothing, his blessing to seek.

Take time to be holy, the world rushes on; Spend much time in secret, with Jesus alone. By looking to Jesus, like him thou shalt be; Thy friends in thy conduct his likeness shall see.

Take time to be holy, let him be thy guide, And run not before him, whatever betide In joy or in sorrow, still follow the Lord, And, looking to Jesus, still trust in his word.

Take time to be holy, be calm in thy soul, Each thought and each motive beneath his control. Thus led by his spirit to fountains of love, Thou soon shall be fitted for service above.
