# From the Pastor

## Ordinary Time

January 6<sup>th</sup> is the traditional date to celebrate Epiphany which is the “official” end of the Christmas season (at least as far as the church calendar is concerned – if you want to leave your tree up until June, that’s okay with me). Epiphany is when we remember and recount the coming of the Magi or Wise Men who followed the star and brought gifts to Jesus and his family.

So Christmas officially ends January 6<sup>th</sup> and Lent, the next significant Church season, begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18<sup>th</sup>. In between Epiphany and Lent (and between Pentecost and Advent) the weeks are simply called “Ordinary Time” and comes from the Latin word “ordinal” which means that the weeks are numbered, not that they are commonplace or routine. And yet, that’s kind of how we treat those weeks – to be mundane or, well, ordinary.

One thing the Bible shows me pretty clearly is that God shows up in the mundane and ordinary time and that God calls us to be faithful in between the big events. In fact, God seems to often interrupt the ordinary time to do something extraordinary.

For Peter, Andrew, James and John it was just another day fishing, throw the nets out, haul them back in, gather up the catch (if any), lie about the big one that got away (that can’t be a new thing, right?):

*As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. “Come, follow me,” Jesus said, “and I will send you out to fish for people.” At once they left their nets and followed him.*

Mark 1:16-18

For Jesus and the disciples, it was probably an ordinary day of traveling around, teaching and bringing evidence of the Kingdom of God to everyone who would listen. For a man named Bartimaeus, it was probably another day begging, another day of self-humiliation and uncertainty, just like every other day had been:

*Then they came to Jericho. As Jesus and his disciples, together with a large crowd, were leaving the city, a blind man, Bartimaeus (which means “son of Timaeus”), was sitting by the roadside begging. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, “Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!”*

...

*“What do you want me to do for you?” Jesus asked him.*

*The blind man said, “Rabbi, I want to see.”*

*“Go,” said Jesus, “your faith has healed you.” Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus along the road.*

Mark 10:46-47, 51-52

God is constantly at work in the most ordinary of moments. Jesus’ parables are full of those ordinary moments: a sower casting seeds, a woman mixing yeast into dough, a wedding party, a farmer plowing his field, a vineyard owner evaluating a fruitless fig tree and more.

God shows up in the ordinary time, in the everyday moments, as we are faithful in those ordinary, mundane days.

So watch for what God is doing. Practice gratitude in the small things. Stay faithful in prayer, in scripture, in generosity, and in simply being present with one another. And like a tree that slowly, day by day, stretches its roots toward life-giving water, our lives grow deeper and more rooted in the Living Water, Jesus, and we grow more deeply connected to one another. This is the quiet, holy work of Ordinary Time.


