Thankfulness Challenge

was trying to come up with some super clever idea for the November newsletter article, but I keep circling back to Thanksgiving (of course).

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever. -Psalm 118:1

Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

-1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

I'm sure I've written and preached before about the benefits of living a life of gratitude. A quick Google search tells me that studies show that people who live lives of thankfulness report fewer physical complaints like headaches and digestive issues, sleep better, seem to have a lower risk of cardiovascular disease and, some studies even suggest, might even live longer. Other studies look at emotional health and how thankful people tend to have less stress and anxiety and seem to be better equipped to handle emotional setbacks and negative experiences. Thankful people tend to have more positive relationships and are often more generous and empathetic toward others.

I did a quick search of the New American Standard Bible and the phrase "give thanks" appears in the Bible 63 times, 2/3rds of those in the Psalms, like the beginning of Psalm 118 above, where time and again we are reminded to give thanks to God because of who God is and how God cares for us. Paul uses the phrase 6 times in his letters, several times saying that he gives thanks to God for the people of the churches he is writing to.

But in 1 Thessalonians 5, Paul says to "give thanks in all circumstances."

A lot comes at us. Life is unpredictable and difficult, terrible, sometimes tragic things happen to us and to those we love. Yet... there are always reasons to be thankful. Not FOR those circumstances, but in the midst of those circumstances.

When my dad was dying of cancer, I was thankful for the time that I got to spend with him, the conversations that we had. Even small and simple things like missing a turn when I'm driving following my GPS. I could get mad or frustrated, but what if I was thankful for the GPS rerouting and getting me back on track instead? What if we chose to be thankful people?

Here's a challenge for the month of November. Every day, find something to be thankful for and write it down. I know some people will take to Facebook or other social media and do this kind of thing and that's fine. That feels more like it's for attention than to truly be thankful to me, but that's really a comment on how I view social media as a whole.

Anyway, find something every day to be thankful for, write it down. Each day review the list as a prayer as you prepare to write that day's thanksgiving. Make a habit of thankfulness. Maybe you'll just do this for 30 days and then stop, but pay attention to how your thoughts change, how your life might be a little different because your perspective has shifted, even slightly, toward "give thanks in all circumstances."

So I encourage you to try this prayer experiment – to give thanks to the Lord for he is good every day for a month and see how things are different.


