he New York Times ran an article called, "How to Keep the Supply Chain From Ruining Your Christmas."

Acknowledging that inflation is at a 30 year high and the supply chain has been struggling since mid2020, the authors of the article recommend that some items are best purchased early as there won't be
enough supply and won't be deep discounts (things that didn't surprise me like phones, computers and
gaming consoles, but some things did surprise me like books, bicycles and stand-mixers) while some other

I wonder how much our Christmas celebrations will be affected by the combination of higher prices and limited availability of goods. It's the was supply and demand is supposed to work, I suppose (Economics classes were a long time ago), and things will eventually level out to whatever the (I know we hate the phrase) "new normal" will be.

What really struck me about the headline was the idea that not getting the "stuff" we expect for the Christmas season would ruin Christmas. And I get it, but, of course, I also want to push against it.

The supply chain that I'm much more interested in seeing renewed this Christmas season doesn't have anything to do with shipping containers floating across the ocean or empty shelves at the store.

Christmas is a sacred celebration, our remembering God stepping into creation in a way that revealed God's grace and God's love for us all.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.

The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

eace. One of the most beautiful places for our minds to rest. Peace. It is found in so many Christmas hymns. It is found in the Bible over 300 times. It was important to God and He makes it important to us every day of our lives.

Like most other churches, Grace Church has faced challenges over the past several years; most recently, a shrinking membership and a world-wide pandemic. These challenges have placed further financial stress on an already stressed budget.

Grace's Finance Committee has revised the presentation of the church's income and expenses in order to be more transparent with our financial position. The major categories of the budget below include expenses for maintaining our church building and property, paying our church staff, funding the church's ministries and outreach, and other expenses.

In order to cover administrative expenses and church ministries over the past few years, the church has borrowed funds from other church accounts, shown below under "Borrowed Funds". The finance committee is exploring ways to reduce expenses and/or increase income to balance the budget and reduce the deficit below.

We are asking all members of the congregation to pray about your stewardship for the church and consider your contributions to help Grace in these challenging times.


