10,000 Minutes

ince, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

(Colossians 3:1-4)

A friend told me about a podcast called 10,000 Minutes. The gist of it is that there are about 10,000 minutes in a week, and it matters how we use those minutes.

We are inundated every day with messages about the stuff of this world, the "earthly things" that Paul mentions in Colossians. A lot of it is fairly innocuous: advertisements for more comfortable mattresses, tastier beverages, better smelling laundry detergent; videos of cats and dogs being adorable, funny tweets about raising kids; and on. Some of it is important: news of a disaster like an earthquake or a train derailment, weather alerts, schedule changes. All of it, the good, the bad and the otherwise, all of it is noise. Noise we have to filter, to choose what to give our attention to and what to push aside. Paul's challenge for us is to use godly wisdom in this kind of discernment. He is *not* suggesting that we ignore these "earthly things" but to not "set our minds" on them. To not let them become so consuming that we are distracted from our relationship with God in Christ.

So how do we use those minutes when we are immersed in the "earthly things"? It really comes down to setting our hearts toward God.

From C.S. Lewis, Mere Christianity:

"People often think of Christian morality as a kind of bargain in which God says, 'If you keep a lot of rules, I'll reward you, and if you don't I'll do the other thing." I do not think that this is the best way of looking at it. I would much rather say that every time you make a choice you are turning the central part of you, the part of you that chooses, into something a little different from what it was before. And taking your life as a whole, with all your innumerable choices, all your life long you are slowly turning this central thing either into a Heaven creature of into a hellish creature: either into a creature that is in harmony with God, and with other creatures, and with itself, or else into one that is in a state of war and hatred with God, and with its fellow creatures, and with itself. To be the one of creature is Heaven: that is, it is joy, and peace, and knowledge, and power. To be the other means madness, horror, idiocy, rage, impotence, and eternal loneliness. Each of us at each moment is progressing to the one state or the other."

Lewis might be a bit heavy-handed with the metaphor, but I think he is very accurate about the process. What he describes – a daily choosing to be in harmony with God or fighting against God – is what **Sanctification** is all about.

While salvation comes to us in a moment – that moment when we turn our lives over to Christ. Though many of us don't have a single defining "June 13th 1972 at 3:14 in the afternoon, it was rainy" kind of moment of conversion, I think we can look back and say with some certainty that there was this turning point in our lives when we took following after Jesus more seriously, when we actively and intentionally sought to shed

ourselves of the weight of sin and the hurts of the past and really received the forgiveness and new life that Jesus offers.

Salvation comes in a moment. There was before, and there is after.

Sanctification – which is just a long word for "becoming more holy" or "becoming more godly" – usually happens not in big moments, but in those small and quiet decisions we make every day.

How will I respond to:

- My neighbor's angry rant about how noisy and messy my kids are...
- That person in church who always criticizes me...
- That fast-food drive through that never gets my order right...
- My spouse who doesn't seem to appreciate me...
- My kids who never listen...
- My parents who never listen...
- That post on Facebook about that political thing that I can't stand...
- ... and a million more decisions every day.

Lewis is right in this. These decisions, these little moments, move us closer to God or away from God – a person who is "...in harmony with God, and with other creatures, and with itself, or else into one that is in a state of war and hatred with God, and with its fellow creatures, and with itself."

How are you using those 10,000 minutes? "[S]et your hearts on things above, where Christ is..."

The Present Situation

Church Unity Through Paul's Eyes Based on lectures by N.T. Wright

iven how concerned Paul was for the early church, he may well be dismayed at our situation now. The whole idea of this new community was to live in a way that was so attractive as to influence the culture around itself for the better. The world doesn't see much



clarity on cultural issue from the church, mostly because we can't agree within ourselves. How then, can we expect to influence culture towards the *epieikes* Paul desired?"

Epieikes is Greek and means to blaspheme no one; to be gracious, to show complete gentleness to all.

N.T. Wright continues by stating that "we have to think and teach freshly and wisely about the key cultural issues of our day. This only happens when we generate communities that are living by what they say; that are neither compromising nor standoffish, communities that are wise and cheerful and helpful; the sort of people other people like to have as neighbours."

The Grace Church building is in a neighborhood that most of its members and attendees aren't within walking distance of. So, how does that neighborhood see Grace as a neighbor? Is it strictly a building that offers a place to park overnight? Has "Covered by Grace" kept some of them warm during the cold of winter? And, if some have entered our doors, were we neighborly? According to N.T. Wright, "the public witness is first and foremost *local.*" That goes right along with the study that Pastor Bill led on The Art of Neighboring and our five Core Values:

Extravagant Generosity Authentic Engagement
Transformational Discipleship Extraordinary Grace Word-Centered Mission

These Core Values aren't just for use when you are in or acting on behalf of Grace Church. They are to be used daily as you interact with all people. N.T. Wright ends his booklet with this: "It's not easy, but this is the challenge that Paul was holding up before the Philippians and the other churches of the time. And it's the challenge his letters still hold up before us. We need to pray for that witness to shine through."

Debbie first heard a pipe organ when she joined her parents in worship on Palm Sunday at the age of 4 or 5. She was spellbound from the first note of the prelude, thrilled with the hymns and stood straining at the

door to hear the last notes of the postlude while the other children ran up and down the sidewalk waving palms. She knew that day what she was going to do with her life.

Piano lessons started at age 7, organ lessons at 12. She played her first service on an electronic organ at 12, then was hired at 14 to play pipe organ at First UMC, Kane for 2 services every Sunday and 3 choir rehearsals each week—children, youth and adults. Over fifty years later, playing the organ is still her joy and passion.

Debbie is a graduate of Grove City College. She was married for 36 years to Jim Airgood, who passed away in 2016. Together they operated Jim Airgood Busing, doing school transportation for over 20 years. Debbie continued to run the van portion of the business for 3 more years following his death, retiring in 2019. Jim and Debbie have two children, Rebecca Miller, who joins her at Grace along with her sons Hemi and Warn; and Michael, a United Methodist pastor in Clairton and Glassport, PA. Debbie's father, Virgil Gillotti, also joins her at Grace.
