From the Pastor

Waiting

I've never been much good at waiting. You'd think I'd be better at it – when I was a kid everything I ever ordered out of a comic book took 4-6 weeks for delivery (and those x-ray glasses were a total hoax!). And the process!!! I had to save up my allowance, go to the post office and get a money order (and pay extra for THAT) and fill it out and send it in. And hope springs eternal in [a young man's] breast (or so said Alexander Pope) so the next day I'd check the mailbox. No package. And the next day. No package. And again. And again. Turns out I've never been very good at waiting.

Now it's worse. Online shopping has ruined me. If I can't get it shipped for free in two days... why bother? I can't wait forever after all! Super-fast internet, microwave meals, quick charging batteries, instant rebates (remember mailing those clippings in back in the day – man, I'm getting old). Everything is in a hurry today.

But waiting can be a spiritual discipline. And it's not one that I'm very good at, either.

Psalm 27:14 says:

Wait for the Lord;
be strong and take heart
and wait for the Lord.

Lamentations 3:25-26 says:

The Lord is good to those whose hope is in him,
to the one who seeks him;
it is good to wait quietly
for the salvation of the Lord.

Isaiah 40:31 says:

But those who wait on the Lord
Shall renew their strength;
They shall mount up with wings like eagles,
They shall run and not be weary,
They shall walk and not faint.

While we may not like to wait, God calls us to patience (or as the KJV calls it longsuffering). I want God to do what I want God to do *right now*. God says, "Wait for the Lord."

In a few weeks we will be celebrating the resurrection of Christ – Easter Sunday! But the week leading up to Easter reminds us of the spiritual discipline that waiting for God can be. On Maundy Thursday we read of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane praying from the very depths of his being to be released from what is coming. "If it is possible, let this cup pass from me." (Mt 26:39) Waiting in agony for a response, waiting in agony for what he knows is coming in the next hours.

After Jesus' crucifixion, death and burial, the disciples are lost and bewildered, waiting for... they really don't even seem to know what they're waiting for because when Mary tells them on Sunday morning that Jesus is alive again, they don't believe her. After Jesus' ascension, the disciples wait in Jerusalem for Jesus' promise of the coming of the Holy Spirit to be fulfilled (and they finally seem to be able to wait this time! – Luke 24, Acts 1).

Wait upon the Lord. If we trust that God really does have everything under control (however we come to understand that), then we need to trust in God's time and God's timing – in whatever it is. Have you been praying about something day after day but you still don't seem to have an answer? Wait upon the Lord. Do you struggle with some sin in your life? (I can have a very judgmental spirit, for example). Keep confessing, keep repenting, keep trusting that God is working on you. I write this as there's rumblings in our denomination about the theological and cultural divide, I write this as there's rumblings in politics about ideologies and blame-shifting on both sides, I write this as families are struggling to make ends meet or struggling to reconcile differences or figure out how to move on. I write this as churches struggle to meet the money and people demands of doing ministry in this climate of financial insecurity and personal over-commitment (and Grace Church is feeling it too!).

Yet... God has always come through. God always will come through.

They that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength.

AAHHH and to have the patience of Job!

Appropriately, I will end with Revelation. At least 3 times John uses the phrase "patient endurance". That really puts it all into perspective patience for the long haul! Patience through the anticipation of days to come; through the trials and uncertainty. And all the while, waiting for the Lord to return.


We still have openings in both classes for the 2022-2023 preschool year. Please contact the church office if you know of someone in need of a registration form!

"He will feed His flock like a Shepherd."

Isaiah 40:11a


