From the Pastor

To Be and to Do

ho was the last person you have talked with about Jesus?" That's a tough question, isn't it? I mean I get a little twisted up inside when someone asks me a question like that. Look, I talk about Jesus all the time, right? I'm constantly talking to people about Jesus – it's my job, but more importantly, it's my calling to ministry.

But...

The question, at least as I hear it, is "Who was the last person *who doesn't know Jesus as Savior* you have talked with about Jesus?"

And that's different, right? Leading a Bible study or preaching a sermon or even having a deep theological conversation with those already familiar with Jesus is easy. The conversations with those who are far from God are much harder.

I was thinking about Jesus' last words in the Gospel of Matthew and then in the book of Acts. They are similar, but... different. That's not to say that one is right and one is wrong, but rather that the focus of those two moments is different, and thus emphasize different words that Jesus said.

In Acts, Jesus says:

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

You will be my witnesses. You will represent me, my words, my teachings, empowered by the Spirit of God. The emphasis here is on how our lives – the words we say, the things we do (and don't do) – will demonstrate a life lived in following Jesus. "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." (Luke 9:23) To BE a disciple is to set myself aside and to live a cross-bearing life that shows that I have been changed and made new by this relationship that I have with God through Jesus Christ.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus says,

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

(Matthew 28L18b-20)

Go and make disciples. This is the call to action. This is the challenge for us to answer that opening question: "Who was the last person you have talked with about Jesus?"

The first, "you will be my witnesses," is about being a disciple and the second, "go and make disciples," is about the great call to ministry that all Christ followers share: to spread the Good News and share the truth of God's love and mercy found in the person of Jesus Christ.

I find it most challenging to have a conversation with someone about Jesus if I have no relationship with them ahead of time. But if, even in my broken and incomplete way, my life can be a witness to the faith that I have

and I can actually care about what's going on in another person's life – their struggles and their triumphs, their trivia and their world-changing moments – then not only is it easier for me to talk about my faith, ground has been prepared in that relationship for the seeds of that faith to possibly grow.

Our task is two-fold: to Be a Disciple of Jesus so that we can go and Make Disciples of Jesus. And... it's not optional. This is the task we were called to.

he Agape Class studied Rob Renfroe's book The Trouble with the Truth several years ago. It was an excellent study of how to balance truth and grace in our lives. In learning about the Cultural worldview vs the Spiritual worldview, one concept really stood out to me. It is, "A lie unchallenged often becomes accepted as reality".

Think about that If you don't know that a statement is a lie AND it is repeated enough, then you may begin to believe it. Given today's information super highways, opinions are stated and spread and spread and spread. Of course, we know that "if it's on the internet it must be true" ... right? NOT!! Is something true just because a majority of people think so? Or because a well-known person declares it as truth? Of course not.







As members of a moral society we all need to practice discernment. AS Christians within that society, how do we tell truth from opinion? We must do our own research. That includes searching out reliable sources. Also, enlisting the help of reference librarians and professionals in that area of study. However, when it comes to cultural "norms" vs moral, ethical and spiritual truths, discernment becomes more challenging.

God's truth is the same today as it was yesterday and as it will be tomorrow! Our reliable source is the Bible. At any stage of our Christian life, it is advisable to also consult with other Christians who have proven themselves to be knowledgeable and trust worthy. From St. Paul to Dietrich Bonhoeffer to Billy Graham to our own small group leader and Pastor; we need to surround ourselves with Christian advisors. Then, with our heads and hearts brimming with information, we sit quietly before our God in prayer.

All of what is written here is succinctly stated in Romans 12:2: **"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve** (ie: discern) what God's will is – His good, pleasing and perfect will (ie: the TRUTH)."




