# **Being One Who Loves God**

As I have been getting ready for our worship services in December, I have been reading the nativity stories in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Matthew begins in a very Jewish way, I think, by tracing the genealogy of Jesus right at the beginning of his Gospel account, tracing the line (in a very structured, formal way) from Abraham who received the covenant from God to Joseph, the husband of Mary. Luke, as it is, has a much more awkward genealogy which he doesn't even get to until chapter 3, after all the events of Jesus'

ecember is upon us. I can't believe that Advent is here already!

In fact, Luke's introduction to his Gospel is very different from the other three (while each of them starts out differently, yet none have this kind of introduction – they start *in media res* [in the middle of the action] if you will).

birth, his presentation in the Temple as an infant and his adventure in Jerusalem as a twelve-year-old boy.

Many have undertaken to draw up an account of the things that have been fulfilled among us, just as they were handed down to us by those who from the first were eyewitnesses and servants of the word. With this in mind, since I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught. (Luke 1:1-4 NIV)

The first most notable thing is that Luke tells us right off the bat that he didn't witness these things, but that he relied on word of those who did. Directed by the Holy Spirit, Luke put the stories and teachings of the Gospel that bears his name into the order that we have it today (even where it is different from the Gospel of Mark, which seems certain to have been one of his sources). In other words, Luke had a plan in constructing this writing about the life and teaching and death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. He tells us as much. "I too decided to write an orderly account...so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught."

What drew me to this introduction, however, was not the what or how of Luke's plan, but the WHO. In this case, he says, "I too decided to write an orderly account *for you, most excellent Theophilus*..."

Did you ever wonder who this Theophilus is? It could be just some random Bible name, lost to history (there are many, after all), but there's something about this name, and the way Luke uses it, that makes me (and many people much smarter than me) think that this is something else.

Theophilus (θεόφιλος) translates from the Greek as "Friend of God" or "Beloved by God" or "One who Loves God" (Theos – God; philos – love). True, this *could* be a random name of someone, perhaps a high-ranking Roman Official (hence the "most excellent" appellation), but it seems just as likely that Luke is writing to *all who love God*, to all who are beloved by God, to all who are friends of God.

So, if Luke is writing to all who would call themselves beloved of God, what then is his "plan" (or agenda) for writing this Gospel? Afterall, none of the Gospels are simply biographies as we think of biographies today – simply a recounting of someone's life in chronological order. Each of the Gospel writers wants us to "get" something out of what they wrote. Luke says, for Theophilus, it is to "know the certainty of the things you have been taught."

This Christmas season, may the stories of Jesus be more than stories for you, but may these stories deepen

and enrich your faith, so that all of us who are beloved by God will "know the certain of the things [we] have been taught."

Have a blessed Advent and a happy Christmas!

#### **Special Church Conference Results**

On November 22nd we had a Church Conference to vote on the Resolution of Disaffiliation. Pastor Bill opened with a prayer and introduced our District Superintendent, Rev. Sang Choi, who conducted the Church Conference.

There were 147 ballots cast with the following results: 70 votes for disaffiliation 74 votes against disaffiliation 3 abstentions

In order for the resolution for disaffiliation to pass, a 2/3rds majority was needed and was not reached. Thus, the resolution did not pass and Grace Church remains in the United Methodist Denomination. A second ballot (electing representatives to speak with the Conference Trustees regarding the financial obligations of disaffiliation) was rendered moot as the first resolution did not pass.

Thank you for all who prayerfully attended to this important Church Conference.
