Life More Abundantly

n John Chapter 10 Jesus says, "I am the gate for all the sheep." (v6) That's kind of a weird image – but he's talking about surrounding us with his presence, like a sheepfold (a pen with a gate). "I am the gate; whoever enters through we will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture." (v9) So Jesus extends the image – not only when in the sheepfold, but when in the pasture (he'll expand on that in verse 11, "I am the good shepherd."). But it's verse 10 I want to zero in on: "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full [or have it more abundantly, NKJV]."

In 1938, the Harvard Study of Adult Development began to seek out some of the root causes that make people flourish. The study started with 724 disadvantaged boys from Boston, then traced through their spouses and, more recently, 1300 descendants of those initial 724. What they found as a constant for a fulfilling and satisfying life was not some of the things we often think of: it was not primarily from wealth, success at work, freedom to travel, greater material acquisitions. (The Atlantic did a long article on this on January 19th)

The primary driver for a fulfilling life – for life more abundantly – is deep and connected relationships. We as Christ followers don't need an 85-year-long study to tell us this. These are Jesus' own words. "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35) The Apostle Paul echoes this truth so many times: "Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ." (Ephesians 5:21) "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing." (1 Thessalonians 5:11) There's a hundred other places.

Deep relationships matter to our mental, physical and spiritual well-being. God's intention for us is to be in communion with God and in community with one another. That is life more abundantly.

So, during Lent, each Sunday I challenge you to walk up to someone you don't know at Grace Church and introduce yourself. Sure, it might be awkward for a minute, but have a chat. "This is how they'll know you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Then, during the week, do the same thing outside of the church. A neighbor. The guy who walks his dog past your house every day. Someone at work, at a restaurant, at the store. People you see all the time but don't know. "This is how they'll know you are my disciples, if you love one another."

And 99% of the time you'll only end up acquaintances (at the most!), but you can't form deep relationships if you don't take that first step. And once you know somebody by more than a category (he's no longer "the guy who walks his dog past my house" but he's Joe who lives two blocks over), we make connections, we begin to love people because they are now people and not just categories.

Life more abundantly.

hat Paul was describing throughout his letters to the early churches was a unity that was completely inexplicable by the cultural standards of the day."



Prior to the birth of the Christian church, Jews and Gentiles did not associate with one another. The Jewish people identified themselves as God's chosen people. Anyone who was not Jewish was a Gentile. However, the grace of God was available to everyone by virtue of the sacrifice of His son; who then rose from the dead, ascended into heaven and sent the Holy Spirit to live within us. Consequently, some Jews and Gentiles became united in spreading the good news of Jesus Christ and working together to form the Christian church. So, *unity done right* is all about associating with people who are not exactly the same as oneself. While that is important *within* the church, it is, perhaps, even more so *outside* of the church!

How many of your acquaintances or co-workers know that you are a Christian? Does your behavior reflect the values taught by Jesus? Do you think "WWJD" (what would Jesus do?) but not act on it? OUCH – this is hitting a bit too close to home for me too!

God does not intend for us to do this on our own. He is always present to guide us along. And we often find Him present in His people. We have heard the phrase, "it takes a village to raise a child" (African Proverb). I would like to offer up that "it takes a church family to raise up Christians". We need to support one another through prayer, actions and accountability; all of which are grounded in love and provided to us by God's grace – through faith – so that we can do good works.
