Busy

here was a knock on my office door. "Hey, Pastor. Are you busy right now?"

How do you answer that question? Who isn't busy right now? And I don't mean that sarcastically. Ask just about anybody what's going on in their lives and, if they're honest, you better settle in for a long list because we're all going in a lot of directions. And this time of year seems to be the busiest. We've got all the regular life stuff – for me it's stuff here are the church, helping Lori when I can, doing things around the house – but then we add in all the holiday stuff – more church events, family events, Christmas parties, concerts, shopping, wrapping, scheduling the visits, cooking, eating, running around...sigh...

Who isn't busy right now?

But, as someone pointed out to me years ago, busyness is a *choice*. Or, well, maybe a whole series of choices. But the point is, we choose to be as busy as we are. When the girls were very young, they hated having to choose between two enjoyable activities ("You can go to this movie with your friends or come with us to the picnic." Or, well, something like that...). They would cry and demand that it's not fair that they couldn't do both. And every time I would patiently tell them, "Life is about making choices." They're adults now and they face these kinds of situations all the time, as do we all. It's hard for all of us. We all have to make choices – and not usually between something terrible and something wonderful, but between something good and something good. "I could spend the evening watching It's a Wonderful Life with my whole family or we could all go to the Christmas concert together." Good and good.

So, I do my best to apply a principle I've preached on here: what is the *wise* thing to do. Paul writes in Ephesians (5:15-17), "Be very careful, then, how you live—not as unwise but as wise, making the most of every opportunity, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be foolish, but understand what the Lord's will is." I try not to choose busyness, though every day seems pretty full, but I try to choose what honors God and honors others. That seems to be the wise thing to do to me. As I've said many times: we demonstrate our love for God by how we love other people. Not by how many tasks we complete for God. Not by how full our calendar is for God. Wisdom, it seems to me, is to honor God and honor people. And every day that looks different.

And that's why, when you are the person knocking on my door asking that question, "Hey Pastor. Are you busy right now?" I will almost always answer, "No. Come on in. What's up?" because busyness, no matter how good or how urgent, is never more important than the person right in front of me.

So, in this "busy" season, pay attention to your calendar, to your commitments, to your "busyness," in light of what honors God and what honors others as we watch and wait for the Christ.


